

## Calling all university undergraduates and graduates seeking to pursue a legal career in social welfare

### What?

In 1988, Skadden launched the Skadden Fellowship Foundation to commemorate the firm's 40th anniversary. The program provides two-year Fellowships to recent law graduates to pursue the practice of public interest law on a full-time basis. The Foundation has funded more than 1,000 fellowships.

In 2020, Skadden's London office expanded the concept by setting up the **Justice First Skadden Trainee Programme**, known as the **JUST Programme**. The JUST Programme is administered by The Legal Education Foundation's (TLEF's) Justice First Fellowship scheme, which funds training contracts within a not-for-profit organisation that promotes social welfare law. Trainees subsequently qualify as solicitors in the sector.

Under the JUST Programme, Skadden sponsors one trainee selected each year through TLEF's Justice First Fellowship scheme by providing funding to TLEF for the duration of the trainee's two-year training contract. The selected trainee will have the opportunity to train alongside Skadden attorneys in relevant areas, and receive funding for ancillary training support costs. They will also benefit from networking opportunities with the Skadden London office, the U.S. Skadden Fellowship network, and former and current JUST Programme trainees.

### Why?

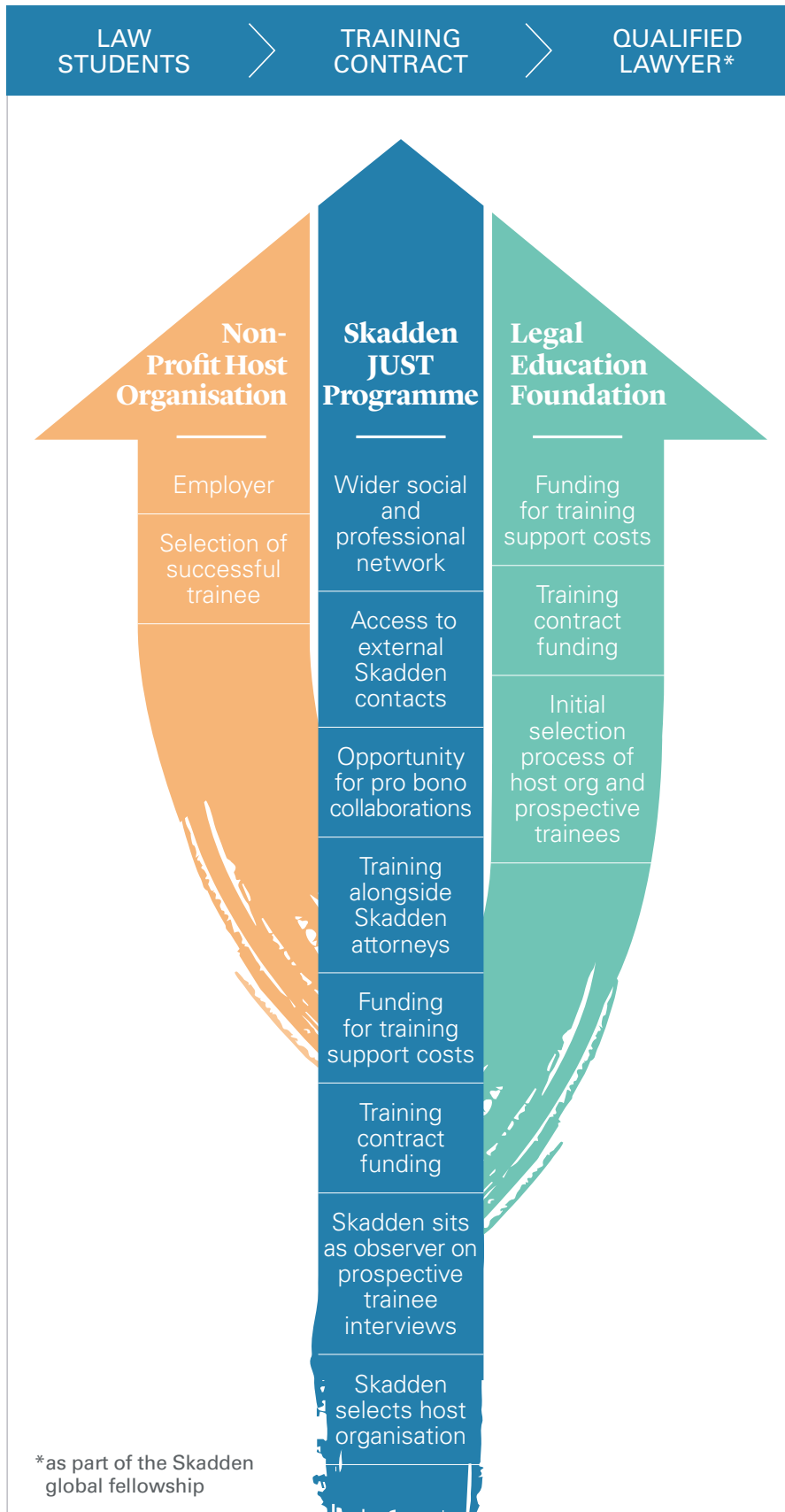
The JUST Programme not only provides an entry point for the brightest undergraduates who wish to pursue a legal career focused on social justice to train in a sector that desperately needs new advisers, but it also directly assists indigent communities that JUST Programme trainees will serve in the course of their training.

### When?

- Applications for the 2025 cycle of the JUST Programme **closed on 28 November 2024**.
- Applicants were notified of the initial selection in **January 2025**.
- Interviews followed **between 20 January – 7 February 2025**.
- The successful trainee will commence their training contract in **April 2025**.
- Our former and current JUST Programme trainees are based at **Greater Manchester Immigration Aid Unit (2021)**, **JustRight Scotland (2022)**, **Norfolk Community Law Service (2023)** and **Law Centre Northern Ireland (2024)**.
- The 2025 host organisation is **Derbyshire Law Centre**. The selected trainee will promote social justice in Derbyshire by contributing to legal services in social welfare law.
